(<u>Hint for the leader</u>: Use the questions on the test plus the memory verse for your weekly quizzes.)

PASS IT ON is a required course in the T.R.I.B.E. distance education programme. (<u>T</u>raining <u>R</u>esources for <u>I</u>ndigenous <u>B</u>ible <u>E</u>ducation.) Once you have completed this course you are encouraged to continue your growth by taking another T.R.I.B.E. course.

If you are taking this course for credit the tests should be mailed, faxed, or scanned & emailed to the Native Bible Centre for grading. The cost for credit for any T.R.I.B.E. course is \$5.00. Native Bible Centre will then return your graded test to you and will keep a copy in your student file.

3. Sin can have power over a life. First, you need to know how sin starts. Read **James 1:13-15**. These verses tell you the steps into sin. These steps go in a certain order. Show the right order by putting a "1" in front of step one, a "2" in front of step two and a "3" in front of step three.



- Temptation is not sin. It is not wrong to be tempted. When you are tempted you must make a decision to do right, or to do wrong. Read 1 Corinthians 10:13 and answer the following questions.

Yes, God has promised to provide us a way of escape when we are tempted to sin. Unfortunately, many times **we do not want** to escape the temptation, but would rather yield to it so we may experience the temporary "pleasure".

2 Timothy 32:5 "People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive... **lovers of pleasure** rather than lovers of God – having a form of godliness but denying its power."

<u>Remember</u>: Satan never shows us sin's consequences, but God tells us the consequences in His Word. Be assured – the consequences of sin are **much more than the pleasure of sin**. The results of sin also **last much longer** than the "good feeling" when we disobey.

6. It is possible to have the Holy Spirit in your life, but not allow Him to control you. **Ephesians 5:18** is a command. God orders you to allow the Holy Spirit to control your life. When God's Holy Spirit controls our life we are then being filled with the Holy Spirit. There are three

conditions you must meet to be filled with the Holy Spirit:

- a) **Ephesians 4:30** You must not grieve (hurt) the Holy Spirit by sinning. He cannot control you when there is sin in your life. When you sin, confess it and forsake it.
- b) 1 Thessalonians 5:19 You are commanded not to put out the Spirit's fire. (Some Bibles use the word "quench.") This is Paul's way of saying that you must not say "no" to the Holy Spirit's leading. The Holy Spirit guides you through God's Word. When He does this, you must obey what the Bible says.



c) **Galatians 5:16** – You must live by the Holy Spirit and not by your own strength. Allow God's Word to fill your mind.



 In the New Testament the word church is used in two ways. It is used in speaking of the universal church and the local church. The universal church is the group of all who have become Christians since Acts 2. Many people think of a building when they think of the church, but when the Bible is talking about the universal church, it means all people who have received Christ as their Savior since Acts 2.

Many people are confused about Spirit baptism.

Spirit baptism is explained in **1 Corinthians 12:13**. Should a Christian seek for this baptism?

SPIRIT BAPTISM

3. Spirit baptism is the placing of a newborn Christian into the universal church (body of Christ). You do not need to seek for Spirit baptism. Someday Jesus Christ will return for the universal church. Until that time more people are becoming part of the universal church every day as they receive Christ as their own personal Savior.

4. The other way the word church is used in the New Testament is to indicate the local church. A local church is a group of believers in a certain place who gather for instruction, fellowship, worship and service.

There is only one universal church, but there are many local churches. You must be a true Christian to be part of the universal church, but you do not have to be a Christian to enter a local church. Local churches meet in church buildings, rented halls, or homes all around the world.





- a) **LAW** The first five books of the Old Testament were written by Moses. They record selected highlights from the creation of the world to the preparation of Israel to enter the land of Canaan.

The husband is to be the head of the home. This does not mean he is to be a dictator, or a mean boss. It means he is responsible, before God, for the family decisions. He should listen to his wife, then make the decision that is best for the whole family.

6. God has also given responsibilities to the wife. In **Titus 2:5**, what is the wife instructed to do concerning the home?

This does not mean the wife cannot work outside the home. It means that God expects her to take care of the responsibilities of the home first.

This word "respect" means to give honor to someone because of his position. The wife is to respect her husband because of the position God has given him as the head of the home.

It means the wife is to voluntarily put herself under the authority of her husband. Lesson 17 Will Jesus Come Again?

**Christ's First Coming**

4. Jesus came the first time as a baby born in Bethlehem. The story of His first coming is found in the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John). Even though He was on earth for over thirty years, a large portion of the Gospels explain the events of His last week on earth. The last week of Christ's life is emphasized because it was during that week that He died on the cross and rose from the dead. That is what the cross represents on the chart. This is the main reason Jesus came the first time.

John 19:28-30 "Later, knowing that all was now completed, ...Jesus said, 'I am thirsty.' ...When He had received the drink, Jesus said, 'It is finished.' With that, He bowed his head and gave up His spirit."


 After Christ returned to heaven, the church began with the coming of the Holy Spirit in Acts 2. Jesus' second coming will be in two parts. First he will come for the church (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18). This truth was unknown in the Old Testament. Then, seven years later, He will come to set up His Kingdom (Matthew 24:29-31).

**Revelation 21:1, 4, 5** "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away...

He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away...

He who was seated on the throne said, 'I am making everything new!' "






6. As you can see from the chart above, the next event in God's program is to send Christ back for the church. This could happen at any time. What effect should this have on how you live now?


